Flood Awareness

- Be Flood Ready
- Know Your Flood Risk
- Only Flood Insurance Covers a Flood
- Insure Your Contents Against a Flood



THE COST OF FLOOD INSURANCE IS A DROP IN THE BUCKET COMPARED TO THE COST OF FLOOD DAMAGE

\$700/YEAR AVERAGE FLOOD INSURANCE POLICY

\$43,000 AVERAGE FLOOD INSURANCE CLAIM

How can you be Flood Ready?

- Monitor River Water Levels Using Stream Gages and Set up WaterAlert through USGS
 - East Branch at Butterfield Rd.
 - East Branch at Short St.
 - St. Joseph Creek at Ogden Ave.
- Join CodeRED Emergency Notification Service
 - Emergency Alert, Weather Alert, Community Alert
- Buy Flood Insurance



Know Your Flood Risk



- Locate your property on your Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)
- Contact the Village if you are newly mapped or newly adjacent to the floodplain
- Talk to your insurance agent about purchasing flood insurance through the NFIP

- Locate Your Property
 - FEMA's Flood Map Service Center
 - Locate your properties FIRM panel
 - Search with the National Flood Hazard Layer Viewer

 - Village's Online Floodplain Map
 - Search by address to locate your property relative to the 1% Regulatory Floodplain

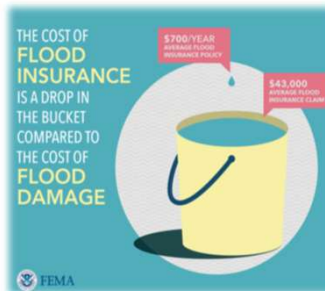


Flood Insurance

Contact your insurance agent or
go to floodsmart.gov to find an agent

Newly Mapped Procedure

- Purchase a policy before August 1, 2020
- Low risk floodplain premiums first year
- Stepped increases until premiums reach the full cost of the flood risk rates
